
Jesus. But how can Jesus do this?

Jesus spoke in figurative language about EVEning, *mother of all living* flesh and blood, when He said love your God and each other even as I have loved you. Jesus spoke figuratively about morning and day when He said *I and the father are as one*. Jesus spoke figuratively about the Holy Spirit of Light in heaven when *He came that he might bear witness of the Light*. (John 1:8 ASV)


When Jesus' figurative language is arranged on the Cross, it is apparent that Jesus sits on the right hand side of the Father, the Most High Holy Spirit of Light sits at the top, and humans at the foot of the cross are directed to love each other.



These things I have spoken to you in figurative language: an hour is coming when I will no longer speak to you in figurative language, but will tell you plainly of the Father.(John 16:25 NASB)

One way Jesus plainly described God 4ways for the cross was when He prayed that God's *kingdom come*. *Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven* in the Lord's Prayer Matthew 6:13:

For thine is the
(1) kingdom,
(2) power, and
(3) glory
(4) forever (Mat 6:13 KJV)
